For the 26th annual Tour of the White Mountains bike race. The event is scheduled this year for Saturday Oct 1, 2022. Epic Rides of Tucson manages the event, and riders can choose rides of 9, 35, or 50 miles on our White Mountains Trail System single-track or a 30-mile forest road ride.

This year, Epic’s goal for total participants in the event is 1200!

TRACKS volunteers mark the course, sweep the riders, help with packet pickup/registration, serve at aid stations, guide riders at critical turn points and road crossings, help at the kids’ ride in the venue, direct campers to sites in the start/finish area, etc.

Spring is here, Summer is coming, and the Tuesday Trekkers are getting ready for their first hike May 10. Meet at 8:00 a.m. on the south side of the Pinetop McDonalds, for a hike of the Billy Creek Connector trail and a portion of the Blue Ridge trail. This will be an easy hike of about 2.5 miles. - May 17 Country Club Trail No. 632. Meet at 8:00 a.m. on the south side of the Pinetop McDonalds. This hike is about 3.25 miles, rated Easy.
- May 24 Springs Trail No. 633. Meet at 8:00 a.m. on the south side of the Pinetop McDonalds. This hike is about 3.6 miles, rated Easy.
- May 31 Chipmunk Connector No. 631A, from the Corral. Meet at 8:00 a.m. on the south side of the Pinetop McDonalds. This hike is about 3.5 miles, rated Easy.



Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest — Lakeside Ranger District News

Spring is here and it's shaping up similar to last year's fire conditions. Not only do we have drought conditions and we are already in high fire danger on Lakeside, we also have more fine fuels on the ground than last spring due to the exceptionally wet monsoon last summer. Please be very careful with fire as we go into the windy spring season.

One of the questions most asked during fire season is about Red Flag. A Red Flag Warning is issued by the National Weather Service when warm temperatures, very low humidity, and strong winds are expected to combine to produce an increased risk of fire danger for a 24-hour period. To reduce fire risk during Red Flag Warnings, activities like campfires, smoking, burning, and some equipment use should be temporarily suspended during the time frame of the warning.

In contrast to Red Flag Warnings, Fire Restrictions are issued by the Forest Service during periods of high to extreme fire danger and stay in effect until the risk has been lowered by enough rainfall. Fire restrictions are of longer duration than Red Flag Warnings and include campfire, smoking, burning, and some equipment prohibitions to reduce fire risk until the high fire danger is past. We are not yet in fire restrictions on the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forests, however, that could change at any time.
